

Public Health Guidance – MoH Approved

Aviation and Maritime Crew – Testing and Isolation requirements

8 November 2021

- 1. Further to the implementation of the updated Safer Travel Policy on Tuesday 2 November, the following is an update to Public Health Testing guidance for aviation and maritime crew.
- 2. The guidance has been approved by the Medical Officer of Health.
- 3. For immediate practicable implementation, arriving maritime or aviation crew who substantively enter Jersey (pass landside) should follow standard arrival processes under the Safer Travel policy.
- 4. This summary process involves:
- A. Completing pre-registration ahead of each separate arrival in Jersey
- B. For passengers who are Fully Vaccinated, or have evidence of a negative PCR test within 72 hours pre-departure, or can evidence history of a positive PCR test in the preceding 90 days no test or isolation requirement
- C. All other passengers must undergo a test on arrival and isolate in line with standard isolation guidance until they receive a negative test result
 - 5. This guidance supersedes all previous guidance for aviation and maritime crew
