

## PERMANENT NOTICE TO MARINERS No 08

### Disposal of yacht cradles and fish store boxes in St Helier Harbour

Reference: Harbours (Jersey) Regulations 1962 and the Water Pollution (Jersey) Law 2000.

1. During the high tides and strong winds, large pieces of wood have been washed off the spending beach in way of the Old Lifeboat Slipway. This debris has caused damage to boats moored within the harbour as well as representing a danger to navigation.
2. Approval of the Harbour Master is required before any boats or other structures/objects such as yacht cradles, store boxes are placed on the slip area to dry out for breaking up and removal. Permission should be obtained through Jersey Coastguard on 01534 447705. Unless otherwise authorised, the following conditions will apply:
  - a. Everything must be removed in its entirety, including metal fittings, ropes etc.
  - b. The boat, or other structure/object must be placed and secured above the tide line no sooner than the day following a spring tide and its removal is to be complete before the smallest neap tide immediately following to ensure debris will not be washed away on subsequent tides.
3. In the event that the item is not removed within seven working days it will be removed by Jersey Harbours and all incurred costs will be recharged to the owner.
